

Order of Liverpool Awards 2024 Guidelines

The Order of Liverpool Awards are presented annually by Liverpool City Council to recognise the achievement of excellence in and/or contributions to all forms of human endeavour which have enhanced the quality of life in Liverpool City.

Order of Liverpool Awards

- Companion of the Order of Liverpool (CLO)
- Officer of the Order of Liverpool (OLO)
- Member of the Order of Liverpool (MLO)

Eligibility criteria

- Nominations must be submitted on Council's official nomination form.
- Nominees cannot apply on their own behalf.
- Nominations must be received by the advertised date. Nominations will not be accepted after this time.
- A breach of Council's Code of Conduct in the previous 12 months would preclude a nominee from being considered for an Award.
- Nominations must include the name and contact number of one referee that can provide supporting evidence for the nomination.
- Nominees who work, volunteer or serve the City of Liverpool qualify for an Award.
- Ratepayers and/or residents in the Liverpool local government area that have made a significant
 contribution over a number of years to the Liverpool community can be nominated in one or more of
 the following categories; civic, community, recreation and sports or commerce and industry
- Persons who reside outside of the Liverpool Local Government Area but contribute to the Liverpool community can be nominated as "honorary members" of the Order of Liverpool.
- That the nominees (that have been excluded) be reconsidered based on the above for the other Awards, such as the Australia Day Awards.
- Posthumous awards will be considered providing the date of a nominee's death occurred within the
 12 months following the previous closing date of the Awards.
- All registrations must include which award the nominee is being nominated for.
- Guidelines for expected quality and length of work and voluntary service to have served in order to be nominated for an award:

The nominees are expected to have the following years of work and voluntary service before they are considered eligible for consideration, while noting that a nominees may be given consideration for an award should they not meet the timing criteria on account of exceptional circumstances:

- i. 5 years' service for consideration for a Member of the Order of Liverpool Award;
- ii. 10 years' service for consideration for an Officer of the Order of Liverpool Award; and
- iii. 15 years' service for consideration for a Companion of the Order of Liverpool Award.
