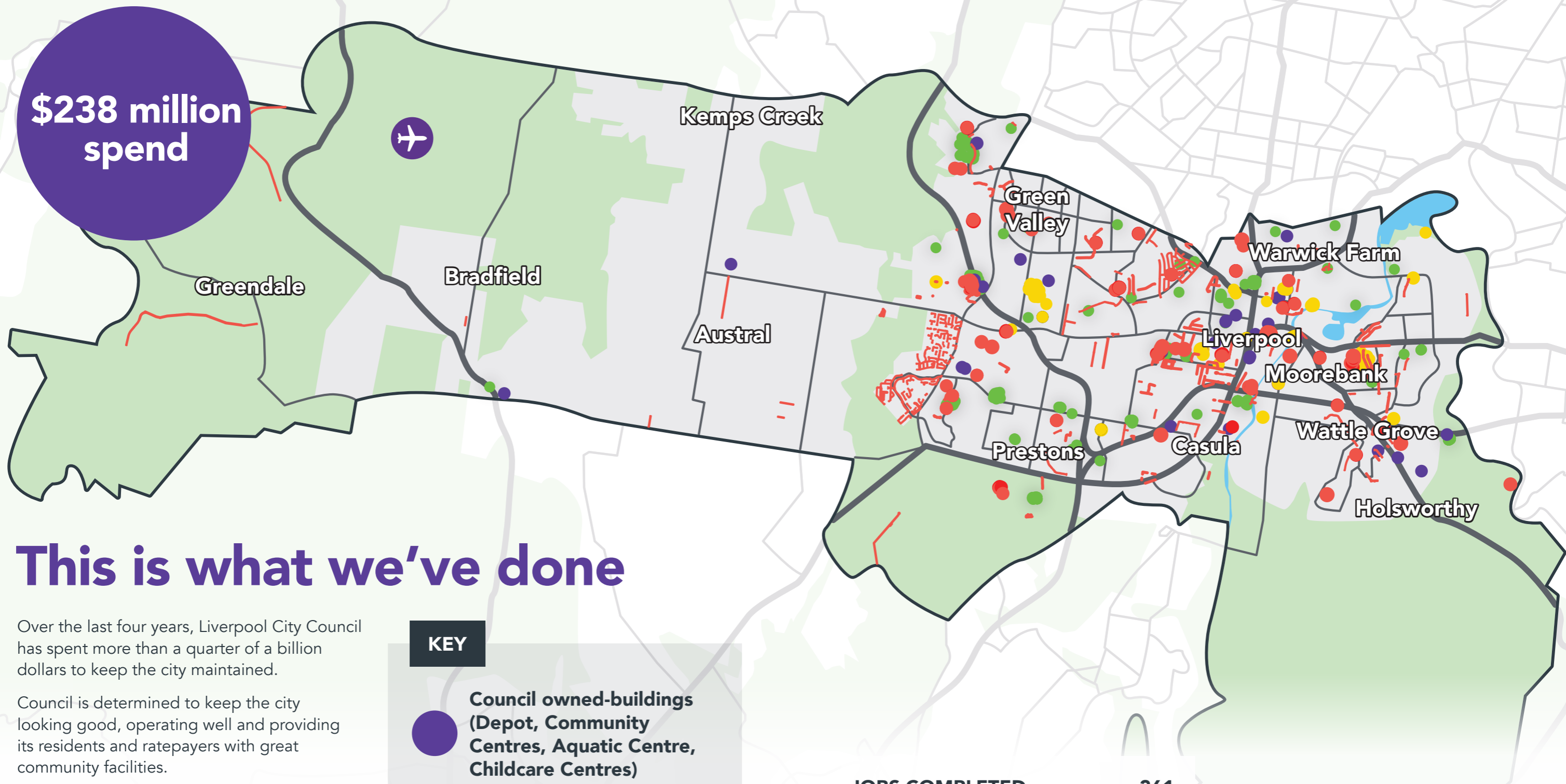


\$238 million spend



This is what we've done

Over the last four years, Liverpool City Council has spent more than a quarter of a billion dollars to keep the city maintained.

Council is determined to keep the city looking good, operating well and providing its residents and ratepayers with great community facilities.

Altogether, some \$238 million was invested in performing some 361 individual maintenance and upgrade jobs.

That's things like road and footpath repairs, upgrading council amenities and facilities, planting trees, upgrading changing rooms and improving sporting facilities.

What was the most money spent on?

Roadworks (\$65 million), closely followed by buildings (\$63 million) and then parks and recreation (\$49 million).
